Kevin Jones is curator of the FIDM Museum at the Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising, Los Angeles. He studied fashion design at the Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising and art history at the University of California, Santa Barbara. Kevin joined the FIDM Museum as Collections Manager in 1999 and was appointed the curator in 2002 to oversee the Museum's 15,000 - piece collection. His fashion and social history expertise encompasses the nineteenth and twentieth centuries with emphasis in haute couture. Kevin's diverse exhibitions cover Hollywood to high fashion. Kevin often presents papers at academic symposia and is sought after for interviews in newspapers and magazines, and on radio and television. Kevin is a member of the Costume Society of America, the Titanic Historical Society, and the Preservation Society of Newport, Rhode Island.



For the last few years Tech Trek has sent campers from the Westminster School District. The Middle School Science and Math buildings are state-of-the-art. Below is a quote from a November 29, 2016 article in the Orange County Register.

"Westminster School District was awarded the Golden Bell Award from the California School Boards Association because of its i4 Blended Learning Initiative which aims to combine technology and traditional classroom techniques to prepare students for college and careers. "We believe we contributed to that success by the value going to Tech Trek gave to our selected Tech Trek campers.

The 2017 UCI Camp packet was received at the end of November. Due to leadership by the National AAUW, several procedures and forms have changed. The WM/FV/HB Tech Trek committee will meet in January to contact the teachers with requests to nominate students. Subsequently the committee will be evaluating the applicant's essays, arranging interviews, and selecting the six campers for 2017. This year the 2017 UCI Camp will be from July 9-15.

Involvement in the Tech Trek committee is very rewarding. There are many interesting tasks and events which need to be completed to meet the specific deadlines.
