Let's look at what we, AAUW members have accomplished.

AAUW Fund –AAUW provided more than 3.7 million dollars in funding for fellowships and grants to 2,550 women and non-profit organizations in the 2017-18 academic year. Yea! Our branch gave \$4,000 toward the Research and Project Grant in the name of Walter and Emily Hackler from the Newport Mesa-Irvine Branch; \$2,500 to Tech Trek which allowed 6 girls to Attend the UCI Math and Science Camp; and \$500 to the Legal Advocacy Fund support. who are going to further their education.

Golden West College Scholarship Program Update 2018

- Each year our AAUW Branch funds one GWC Scholarship currently at \$300.00.
 - (\$250.00 is the minimum to fund an award)
- Shirley Pyle's and Ed Cumming's scholarships are endowed or on-going scholarships funded by the families and donations from friends and AAUW members.
- An endowed scholarship requires a minimum of \$5000.00 contribution. The interest from the invested funds is used yearly to present a scholarship. The minimum scholarship in \$250.00 and can vary from year to year depending on the interest generated by the fund.
- Each year a committee meets to review the scholarship applications.

The guidelines for consideration are:

- 1. Returning student
- 2. Re-entering the workforce
- 3. A 2.5 or better GPA (B average)
- 4. Transferring to a four-year college in the fall
- Memorial Scholarships honoring a member require an opening deposit of \$25.00 which the chairperson sends to the GWC Scholarship Office along with an application and a bio of the individual to be honored. Once the fund has been established, the chairperson distributes a form to accompany the donation to members/friends. Checks are made out to the GWC Scholarship Office and sent directly to GWC. Once the minimum of \$250.00 has been met, the scholarship is funded.
- In 2017 and 2018, AAUW members funded a \$450.00 scholarship for each of these years in memory of Michelle Feicht. The scholarship was closed as no new monies are available. In the past, memorial scholarships were presented to honor Susan R. and Joy Martineau.
