<u>Life</u>

AAUW BRANCH TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP

One-time payment of twenty years' annual AAUW dues, based on the amount of annual AAUW dues the year the member elects to become a Life member. Thereafter, the Life member shall be exempt from AAUW national dues. (Bylaws Article IV, Membership and Dues, Section 2 a (4) (a)).

Honorary Life

An individual member who has paid AAUW dues for fifty years shall become an Honorary Life member and shall thereafter be exempt from the payment of AAUW national dues. (Bylaws Article IV, Membership and Dues, Section 2 a (4) (b).

Honorary Life as defined in Article IV, Section 2 a (4) (b) shall be exempt from payment of national, AAUW CA, and Branch dues.

<u>Dual</u>

Individual member pays national and AAUW CA dues to "main" branch and only branch dues to secondary branch. The person is not counted as a secondary branch member until AAUW national and AAUW CA dues are paid to the "main" branch.

Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel: The Exhibition Christ Cathedral (formerly The Crystal Cathedral) Garden Grove

The Exhibit recreates the wonder of the art of the Sistine Chapel from a new prospective. Thirty-four (34) of the frescoes have been digitally reproduced to original sizes and hung from frames, so, the visitor can explore the artwork up close. The frescos are displayed in roughly the same position as they are in the Sistine Chapel.
