HBs first female Mayor (and councilwoman) and Seal Beach Mayor, who battled developers that wanted to build high-rise buildings for miles along the beachfront. HBs future was shaped by a tireless group of female activists that banded together in the 60s to help save the wetlands, and Norma was in that tireless group. Norma also led the movement for the Central Library in Central Park, which opened in 1975. Norma's name is on a plaque by the front door and another by the reference desk. Norma also led the efforts to build the Butterfly Park on Graham in HB. Norma was a role model for all of us and she will be missed at AAUW meetings.
