The mission and vision of the Free Rein Foundation begin with the belief that "horses heal humans." The Foundation rescues horses and places them in an equine-assisted therapy programs for at-risk youths, veterans, and groups in our community who need a better way to work together.

The Free Rein Foundation is proud to work in the community of Huntington Beach, enlisting the help of the Huntington Beach Police department as well as several divisions of the LAPD. The programs empower people with a process of making better choices for their own lives. All horses have a healing ability that speaks to people at the deepest level of who they are, and the programs of the Free Rein Foundation have an impact that is changing the future of our communities.

The Free Rein Foundation is located in the Huntington Central Park Equestrian Center among a robust community of equestrians, volunteers, and a community of supporters. Each month they host a Hug and Groom event to allow our community to meet the rescued horses, learn about the programs, and interact with the volunteers who care deeply about the horses and their power to heal.

Maria will share with you the mission, vision, and impact of this powerful program, and will reveal her own "free rein" moment of horse healing.

We have heard about the Wage Gap. Well ladies, many of us are retired or soon to be. When we think of retirement, we feel that the Wage Gap doesn't affect us. Well, think again! In a recent update of AAUW's "The Simple Truth about the Gender Pay Gap" research report, women collect 20% less in Social Security benefits than men do, 24% less in pensions, and 30 % less in overall retirement income when you factor in the interest and dividends. Doesn't that just dust your cookies! We need to keep fighting for equal pay rights.

Don't miss the opportunity to receive a tax deduction on your donation for 2019.
