


The first half hour of the meeting will be devoted to branch business, with Marla Jo speaking at 12. Her talk will be followed by a Question and Answer session.




The 2020 Census: Act Now

However, at the last moment, our committee was asked to select the Branch and Shirley Pyle scholarships. It has been a challenging year for schools and colleges. The foundation office is currently working remotely.

In selecting the candidates, our AAUW goal is to acknowledge students returning to college and the workforce and transferring to a four-year college. All four AAUW related scholarships are open and donations can be made directly to the foundation office. The scholarship recipients for 2020 are:

Alisha Gamble-AAUW Branch Scholarship

Alisha is a single parent and re-entering to the workforce. Alisha is very active in campus organizations and currently serving as president of the Alpha Gamma Sigma Honor Society. She is transferring to Cal State Fullerton pursing a degree in Humanities and Social Science after completing multiple AA degrees. Last September, Alisha was diagnosed with MS and credits GWC for helping her through the trying time. Alisha's goal is to return to GWC in a capacity to help support students reach their goals.

Brittany Roy-Shirley Pyle Scholarship


