Before we begin the hike, we will visit the Interpretive Center. The big attraction is the extraordinary variety and number of birds. Birds to see - great blue heron, snowy egrets, pelicans, stilts, grebes, terns, marsh hawks, cormorants and maybe an osprey. We will stop by to check out the blue herons and their baby chicks. Along the way we will see St. Catherines's Lace, a form of wild buckwheat from the Channel Islands with bluish leaves and blossoms with big clusters of tiny, fragrant, white to pink flowers, yellow coastal sunflowers and other plants. There are new kiosks to check out along the way, too, Distance 4 - 5 miles, 2 1/2 hours. Optional: binoculars. Water and hat/visor recommended. Lunch to follow. Public Policy

AAUW California's virtual Lobby Day, 3/24/21, our branch team included Karen Jackle and Donna Kratter, along with Vivian Clecak from Laguna Beach Branch. We spoke with Senator District 34 Assistant Lisa Tran for Sen. Tom Umberg, chair of Judicial Committee which will hear SB62, one of 3 bills AAUWCA asked each team to brief legislator(s) on. AB373 is by Assembly Member Min, who is Karen and Donna's representative, but he was not available. Our lobbyist, Kathy Van Osten made appointments with legislators and arranged for our key opening speakers, Assembly Member Christina Garcia, Chair of the Women's Legislative Caucus, and Assembly Majority Leader Eloise Reyes, author of AB 92, which we are co-sponsoring.

After the opening session, 30 teams of 3 or 4 AAUW members connected with individual legislators or their staff. In these meetings, members communicated information about AAUW CA, their branches and also the three bills which are high priority for AAUW in the current session.

- AB 92 Assembly Member Reyes Child Care Family Fees
- SB 62 Senator Durazo Garment Worker Protection Act
- AB 373 Assembly Member Min Consumer Debt: Economic Abuse

The results of these meetings are important in several ways. Co-Chairs Kathi Harper and Sue Miller met with members of Governor Newsom's staff, who are influential in assisting the Governor in his decisions about signing or vetoing bills, and with Senate President Pro Tem Toni Atkins staff. All of this will enable our lobbyist to better connect with legislators as our bills move through the legislative process from now through September. You can go online to learn more about these bills including their current text and status related to what committee(s) they went to or will go to by upcoming deadlines. By end of August, all bills approved by legislature go to Governor's desk.
