ROBYNE'S NEST

The mission of Robyne's Nest is to provide at-risk and homeless high school students (who are alcohol and drug free), with little to no parental support, in the Huntington Beach and Newport Beach High School Districts, with the resources and support to complete high school and pursue a path to self sufficiency through college, trade school or military options.

Robyne Wood founded Robyne's Nest seven school years ago and has assisted 125 students and currently works with approximately 46 students in school or who have recently graduated and need help landing on their feet.

Many students are struggling when it comes to basic support from their parents for such needs as food, housing, academics and even safety. Many of these students want help and that is why they continue to go to school looking for security, routine and a place to belong.

Robyne's Nest is a proactive approach to help our youth stay away from drugs, crime, homelessness, human trafficking and early parenthood. It provides: financial assistance (Student Living Expense Program); basic needs (food, clothing, hygiene items and school supplies); living resources (referrals to other social service and healthcare agencies); and educational classes in Life Skills.
