Be Well OC

Marshall Moncrief is the Chief Executive Officer of Mind OC, a not-for-profit organization created to advance the community-wide collaborative Be Well OC: a robust, crosssector coalition creating tomorrow's mental health care system. He also serves on the Orange County Commission to End Homelessness. Marshall, a licensed psychotherapist, holds an executive MBA in healthcare management.

Prior to his current role with Mind OC, Marshall served over 15 years as the executive clinical and administrative leader of mental health and addiction services for Hoag Health and Providence-St Joseph Health Systems (PSJH). In this role, he developed the Institute for Mental Health and Wellness for PSJH Southern California, overseeing hospital and primary/specialty care services across LA, Orange County, and the High Desert. He created California's first residential addiction treatment program co-located with an acute-care hospital, and co-founded the ASPIRE consortium, which scaled across four independent health systems a unique treatment program for adolescents and their families. Marshall has enjoyed direct clinical work in private practice, as well as teaching for local colleges and universities.

He lives in Huntington Beach with his wife and 7-year-old son, visiting his 22-year-old daughter at the University of Oregon as often as she'll let him... and he speaks regularly on the need for thorough psychiatric evaluation for anyone considering having kids 15 years apart.

SHIPLEY NATURE CENTER, 9:30A.M.

Meet in the parking lot at 17851 Goldenwest St., HB

Opened in 1974, Shipley Nature Center is an 18-acre fenced natural area within Huntington Beach Central Park. The nature center includes 4000 feet of trails that meander through several habitats including oak woodlands, Torrey pines, meadows and Blackbird pond, a natural freshwater wetland with mature willows and sycamores. At least twenty-two animal species have been spotted in the nature center. Each area in Shipley Nature Center is organized by habitat. Shipley Nature Center is run by the Friends of Shipley Nature Center, a non-profit organization, who manage, operate and take care of the natural landscape. In 2002 the nature center was over grown with invasive non-native plants which had taken over the habitats killing the Redwood trees and choking the pond. The Friends have worked hard to restore the natural California native environment. Carolee Focht, a volunteer for the Shipley Nature Center and AAUW member has made special arrangements to give us a guided tour. The egrets are back and just maybe there will be some baby chicks to see and much more. (Shipley is only opened on Saturdays 9:00AM - 1PM and is free). A suggested donation of \$3 will be collected to help support Shipley Nature Center. Optional: binoculars. Water and hat/visor recommended. After the tour, we will hike over to the Urban Forest. The STEM Gap

As soon as girls start school, they encounter attitudes and expectations about what they 'should' and 'shouldn't' do. This continues throughout their schooling, steering them toward certain career paths and away from others. As a result, when they enter college, women gravitate toward college majors that prepare them for lowerpaying fields, and away from the STEM fields that lead to higher paying jobs. Although women have surpassed men in earning degrees, research shows that women are disproportionally represented in 6 of the 10 lowest-paying college majors, while 9 of the 10 highest-paying majors (all in the STEM fields) are dominated by men.

To ensure a future of equal opportunity and equal rewards in the workforce, we need to start with our educational system. It is critical to remove gender-based barriers that keep not only girls but all students from pursuing their dreams and reaching their potential. Schools must teach with an eye toward tomorrow's economy. The fastest growing, most well-paid sectors require technology, math, and science expertise that many students, especially female students and students of color, are not getting. The education system also needs to support the demand for soft skills, such as problem solving, self-directed learning, communication, collaboration, and creativity.
