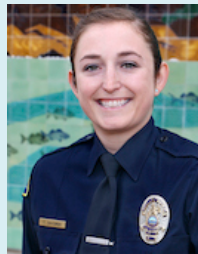

Brief History of the Navy Golf Course

Our meeting this month will be held at the Navy Golf Course. The Navy Golf Course is composed of: two golf courses (Cruiser and Destroyer); putting greens; driving ranges; a restaurant; meeting/banquet rooms; and a pro shop. Our meeting room is very nice and overlooks the greens. The facility's lobby is filled with naval memorabilia.

The history of this facility dates back to 1938 when the U.S. Navy purchased land surrounding Greenbury Point. The acquired land included an 18 hole golf course that been developed in 1928 by the Greenbury Point Yacht and Country Club; it was abandoned in the Great Depression. In the 1940s, nine of the original holes were restored and opened as the Naval Academy Golf Course.

In 1942, one of the top course designers of the day, William Flynn, was contracted to convert the nine hole course into a full 18 hole tract. The new, redesigned course was opened in 1944. In 1966 the course was redesigned by William Bell and renamed the “The Destroyer”.

An overall upgrade of the Navy Golf Course was initiated in 2018 and completed in 2020. Tiger Woods and his father often played here.

**Walking Tour of the Historic Architecture of
Downtown Santa Ana**

The district is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and several buildings are landmarks. Experienced tour guides will show us a variety of commercial and institutional buildings designed in the finest styles from the 1900s to the 1930s such as Art Deco, Classical Revival, Spanish Colonial Revival, and Richardsonian Romanesque. The route covers about 16 blocks. It's flat with some uneven pavement. There are no stairs. The tour is wheelchair accessible.
