#### **Venue Search Update**

We are continuing to research potential venues for monthly meetings in Westminster, Fountain Valley, Huntington Beach and Seal Beach. We have evaluated Country Clubs, Golf Courses, Community Centers, Club Houses and restaurants. Country Clubs and Golf Courses are expensive and in general are not interested in smaller groups (under 50 attendees); some have established a significant spending requirement. The restaurants we have looked at do not have private backrooms and are quite noisy. Clubhouses and Community Centers would require us to set up the tables and chairs as well as put them away. Except for the Country Clubs and Golf Courses, the other facilities do not provide equipment our speakers need (microphone, screen and projector).

At Country Clubs, Golf Courses, Community Centers and Club houses in addition to the meal charges (food, tax and gratuity), we are charged for the room and for the equipment we use. Room charges can be up to \$300 and equipment charges up to an additional \$200. That is why breakfast ends up costing the Branch over \$30 per person. Inflation pressures are continuing.

We are continuing our efforts. All suggestions are welcome.

When Women Vote, We Change the Conversation!

Since 1881, AAUW has been a leading voice promoting education and equity for women and girls. AAUW encourages women voters to get involved in the political process and gain a better understanding of the impact legislative action can have on our lives.

The recent US Supreme Court Dobbs decision on abortion has stimulated action in many states across the nation, including California. Our legislature passed and Governor Newsom signed AB1666, which will enable a woman coming into California to receive an abortion to be protected from lawsuits originating in her home state. This bill was co-sponsored by AAUW CA! A further step protecting a woman's right to make personal medical decisions is a Constitutional Amendment, Proposition 1, which will be on the November 8 ballot. It would amend the California Constitution to prohibit the state from denying or interfering with an individual's reproductive freedom in her most intimate decisions, which includes the fundamental right to choose to have an abortion and the fundamental right to choose or refuse contraceptives. AAUW CA supports this Constitutional Amendment.

#### **Membership** News

AAU

National has a new membership campaign called, "Shape the future." With this campaign we can offer 50% off of national dues when prospective members join AAUW at an event or meeting. We can also earn one free national membership for every two new members we recruit!

Remember, national dues are the largest part of our dues package, so these new members joining at an event will pay \$71.50 instead of \$105.00. The catch is: they must join AT the meeting or event (no, "Let me think about it") and they must be either entirely new to AAUW or someone who rejoins after two or more years of lapsed membership.

We will start bringing membership applications to our meetings in the Spring.
