The environment created is an exhilarating experience for a person with a physical or learning challenge. It is an opportunity to look beyond the disability and see new life possibilities. Riders are led by trained volunteers around the equestrian arena. The reward is an affirmation for what seemed out of reach becoming reachable and life changing. Students express joy and a newfound confidence. Therapeutic riding can be traced back to the Greeks who used the horse to treat various neurological disorders. In 1952 an individual who had handicaps won an Olympic silver medal. We are so fortunate to have Therapeutic Riding Center in Huntington Beach. This nonprofit was founded in 1990 by a group of dedicated community volunteers who wanted to provide services to those with disabilities. The center is always in need of donations.
