Shake It Up, Baby!

On February 15 we will shake, rattle & roll, as our guest lecturer will be Michael Forrest, Ph.D., who holds a U.S.C doctorate in geophysics (earthquake science). He has been teaching at college level for over 30 years, in subjects as diverse as California geology, earthquakes, rocks and minerals, and oceanography.

Michael's doctoral thesis focused on microseismicity and fault evolution in Southern California (at which time he told future wife Eleanor on their first date that the Vincent Thomas Bridge they were driving over could "snap in half any second" because the Palos Verdes Fault Line runs perpendicular to it, in the waters below. She married him anyway.)

Michael has written several field trip guides, and often conducts adult student groups through the hills of Whittier and Palos Verdes, and leads cub scouts and their leaders on beach walks to learn where all that sand comes from.

On February 15, Michael will lecture to our group about local faults, geology and the earthquake history of our area. Additionally, he will discuss earthquake hazards and safety in the home.

So hold onto your chairs as we embark upon a world of swaying buildings and snapping bridges! If you miss this one, it's no one's "fault" but your own.

2025 AAUW Author Luncheon

Passages: Our Journeys; Our Stories

John W. Thill

John Thill, born in Oceanside, attended Oceanside and El Camino High Schools, then studied business and speech communication at San Diego State University. His father had influenced him to pursue bodysurfing, hunting, and fishing. He is now a wildlife conservationist.

After college, he worked for the Jazzercise Corporation and helped establish JM Television Productions. For 24 years he served in the Hi-Noon Rotary Club and the Rotary Club of Carlsbad, experiences that helped him develop lifelong friendships and a new understanding and appreciation for service. For 19 years Thill worked as a partner in Carlsbad's Personal Strengths Publishing Company. He supported and facilitated leadership and team-building courses for PricewaterhouseCoopers, Indian Health Services, Amazon's Leadership Institute, Harvard's School of Public Health, the University of California Office of the President, and USC's Marshall School of Business.

It took him 36 years to finish and publish A California Love Story, a compilation of letters exchanged between his grandparents in the 1920s.

Hong-My Basrai

Born and raised in Saigon, Vietnam, Hong-My Basrai (née Lê Thị) is fluent in Vietnamese and French. From a very young age, Hong-My has demonstrated a propensity for literature and a love of languages. Transplanted at age 22 to Southern California, she learned English and improvised upon the borrowed language to make it her own.

She holds a degree in Chemical Engineering, and an informal degree in self-taught English. Hong-My is the author of Behind the Red Curtain, A Memoir, about her seven years living inside fallen Saigon under communism. Her writing appears in Eastlit Literary Journal, 2011.

She is a member of the Writers' Club of Whittier, and a board member of Finlandia Institutes of the Arts, a nonprofit organization whose mission is to recognize, support, and expand literary activity in the Inland Empire. She also serves on the board of PIVOT to elevate progressive Vietnamese Americans' political voice.
