Public Policy Update

AAUW's Senior Director Policy & Member Advocacy Meghan Kissell has been very active in Washington DC advocating for women and girls and opposing cuts to education. On behalf of AAUW, she submits letters to congressional representatives and committees. Two letters of note that she submitted last month include opposition to cuts to higher education contained in the budget reconciliation bill (aka the big, beautiful bill) and opposition to the Educational Choice for Children Act, which would establish a nationwide voucher system that would divert public school funding to charter schools.
