HUNTINGTON LIBRARY, ART MUSEUM & BOTANICAL GARDENS

The library, museum and gardens are a collection-based research and educational institution founded in 1919 by Henry and Arabella Huntington. It has been built on the grounds, which were once their home in San Marino.

The Library is one of the world's greatest independent research libraries concentrated in the fields of British and American literature, art and science, stretching from the 11th century to the present. The Art Museum focuses on European, American and Asian art. The Gardens include the Chinese garden, the desert garden, the Japanese garden, and the rose garden.

Departure time will be at 8:45 a.m. in order to allow us plenty of time to arrive by 10 a.m. when the Huntington opens. We will take the first docent led walking tour which begins at 10:30 a.m. The tour is free and lasts approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes. After which you may choose one of several locations to eat lunch and in the remaining time you will be free to visit any areas of the Huntington that may be of further interest to you. There is a wonderful gift shop for you to enjoy.

Regular admission is \$25.00 and \$21.00 for seniors. Parking is free. You may go to huntington.org for further information.

Meet Lynne Cox March 14 at 4 p.m. – 6 p.m.

Swimming to Antarctica Tales of a Long-Distance Swim Written by Lynne Cox

At age sixteen, legendary swimmer Lynne Cox reached her lifetime goal of setting a new world record for an English Channel swim. So she set her goals even higher: She became the first to swim the Strait of Magellan, narrowly escaped a shark attack off Cape of Good Hope, and was cheered across the twenty mile Cook Strait of New Zealand by dolphins. Her daring eventually led her to the thirty-degree waters of the Bering Strait, which she crossed in her usual outfit- just a swimsuit, cap, and goggles. She even swam a mile in the iceberg-choked seas of Antarctica. With a poet's eye for detail, Cox shares the beauty of her time in the water in the sports memoir, which is illustrated with photos and maps throughout.

Prior to writing novels, she worked as a fashion journalist in New York City, where she lived for 17 years. Orange County readers may recognize Nicola's byline from articles she's written for both Los Angeles Magazine and Orange Coast Magazine. Nicola is working on her fourth novel that takes place on Balboa Island in the 1950s.
