We will be visiting the Miller Japanese Garden whose mission is: "...to provide a place of refuge, beauty and learning for all who enter its gates." Built in April 1981 through donations of Lorraine Miller Collins in memory of her husband, the garden is a hybrid art form that combines typical elements of Japanese garden design within the context of its So Cal location. It reflects the University's continued interest in international education, and student and community engagement. We will have a docent led tour of the garden and if we're lucky we may even be able to feed the koi!

Our next stop is the Kleefeld Contemporary Art Museum. It is a short walk (about 800 steps) from the garden. Although it is celebrating its 50th anniversary, it has recently undergone extensive renovation and expansion. If you've ever visited it before during your time on the campus you won't recognize it. The architecture is quite impressive. The theme of the new spring exhibitions is "It Moves Forward Always," and they feature various mediums.

There is free admission to both of these venues but, we are asking for \$1.00 for the docent tour.

Our tour begins at 10:30 a.m. Since parking can be tricky, we are planning to meet in the Hof's Hut parking lot on Seal Beach Blvd. at 9:45 a.m., from where it is strongly recommended that we carpool. Later we will return to Hof's Hut for lunch.

The American Library Association is adamantly against public library privatization. The Friends of Huntington Beach Public Library and a majority of our community members are also opposed to this takeover of our beloved and successful library.
