CASA ORANGE COUNTY: A VOICE FOR FOSTER YOUTH

On September 20 our guest speaker will be Norma Mendoza. Norma started her time at CASA as an intern under the Recruitment Team in 2019. Upon graduating from Chapman University in 2020, she was brought on staff as the Volunteer Recruitment Associate. In 2021, she became the Volunteer Recruitment Coordinator and the Lead for CASA OC's Diversity Committee. Norma then moved into the Diversity Recruitment Coordinator role in 2022, bringing with her an awareness of the need for youth in foster care to feel a sense of belonging. Today, Norma is the Volunteer Recruitment Manager at CASA OC.

Founded in 1985 by the Junior League of Orange County, CASA OC (Court Appointed Special Advocates of Orange County) is a privately funded nonprofit and proud member of the National CASA/GAL Association. Its mission is to provide "a powerful voice and meaningful connection" for children who've experienced abuse, neglect, or abandonment. Since inception, CASA OC has trained over 4,000 volunteers who've devoted more than 1.8 million hours supporting more than 9,000 foster youth.

More than 2,900 children and youth in Orange County are under dependency court jurisdiction at any given time, and there are currently around 194 kids on CASA's waitlist awaiting volunteer advocates. CASA volunteers focus on ensuring each child's best interests are represented—whether in school, health, or placement decisions.

CASA volunteers gather critical information, visit youth twice monthly, interface with courts and care teams, and make treatment recommendations. Outcomes for youth engaged with CASA are strong: in fiscal 2022, 92% graduated high school or received equivalent credentials; 71% improved behavior at home; 76% showed increased future motivation.
